- To raise awareness about the importance of safeguarding constitutional values.

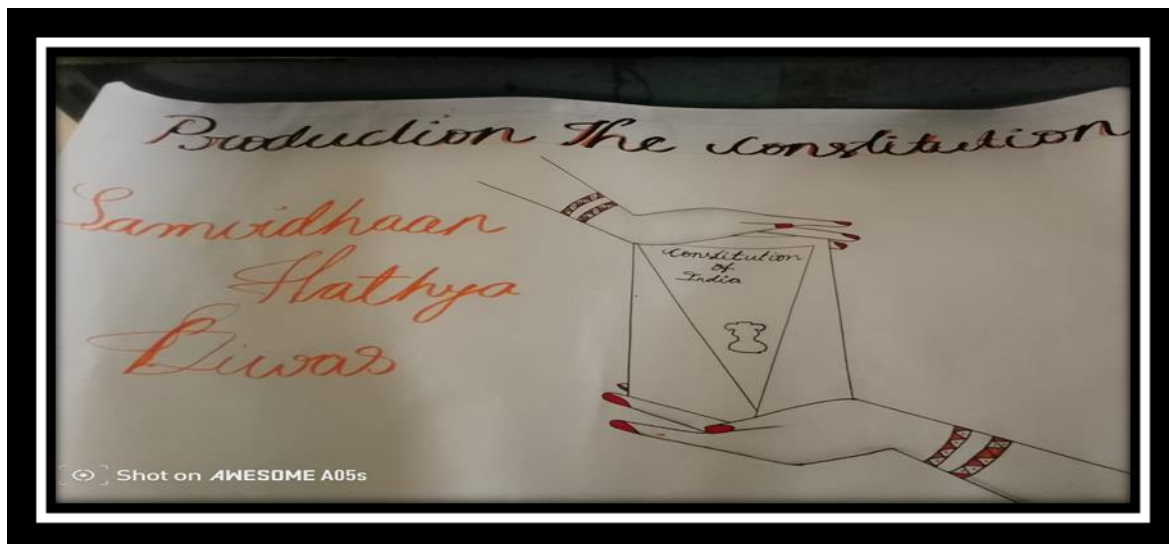
- To reinforce the commitment to democratic principles.

- To emphasize the need for constant vigilance in protecting fundamental rights.

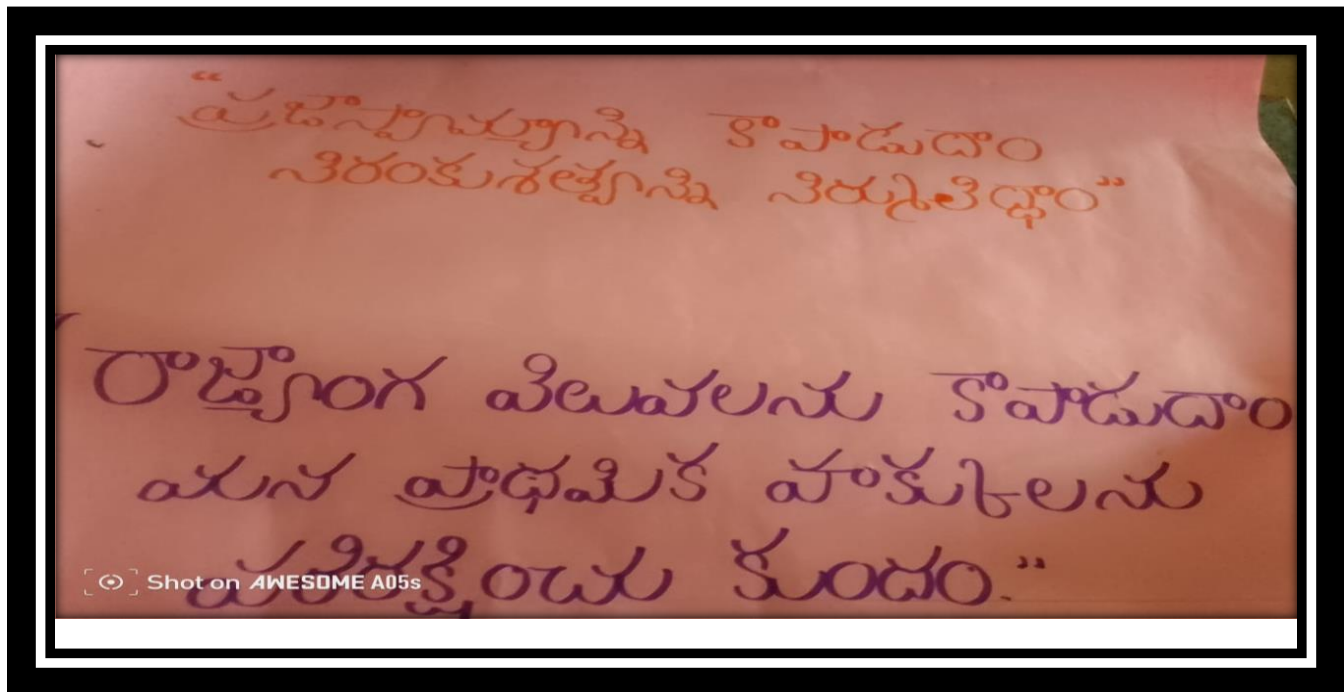
PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS
